Citation:

This understated orchid has a restricted and contracting national range, with its stronghold in the North Downs of Surrey and Kent. It is found in old chalk-pits, calcareous grassland and even on road verges. It can tolerate considerable shade and is often found at the edge of scrub with invasive tall grasses such as tor-grass Brachypodium pinnatum. An historic decline has continued, mainly due to habitat neglect and mismanagement. In Greater London, populations remain in Happy Valley, Hutchinson's Bank (both LB Croydon), Saltbox Hill, High Elms (both LB Bromley), Woodcote Park Golf Course and Roundshaw Downs (LB Sutton). All sites are within Metropolitan SINCs; 3 are in SSSI. Managing authorities: Croydon Borough Council, Bromley Borough Council, Sutton Borough Council, London Wildlife Trust, private (Woodcote Park GC).
